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success. The idea began in a few minds as we saw local Bible colleges closing down and the cost of running a full scale, state credited institution making it impossible to keep these institutions going. Did the early church need state creditation? Well, the idea of a stream lined process to educate christians for ministry was born.

In Ephesians 4, Paul describes how God equips His people with various gifts for the work of the ministry, "so that we may be full grown in our faith." **This growth into spiritual maturity is at the heart of our Institute's mission.**

In past generations, much of this training took place through Christian colleges or universities. Yet we live in a rapidly changing time, and many traditional pathways for equipping believers have become limited, inaccessible, or increasingly scarce. Our vision as a local Bible Institute is to stand in that gap—to support the ministry of our local evangelical churches by offering sound, biblically accurate, affordable Christian education to men and women of all ages.

We are only at the beginning, but by God's grace we hope to expand our course offerings, add new locations, and eventually provide full eight-week online courses. Each step is aimed at strengthening the faith and effectiveness of local church members and leaders.

We ask you to continue praying for us and supporting this mission. You can partner with us by taking a course, sponsoring someone in your church, or giving toward the work. Pray that we will follow God's will and timing, and that we remain faithful to Christ in our daily lives and ministry.

“Mastering Discipleship: Being a Disciple and Discipler”

taught by Dr. James Buchanan and held on Mondays from 6:00 to 7:25 pm.

cost \$80

As a believer in Jesus Christ, you are called to be a disciple, a follower of His way, a participant in His mission in the world. Ministry leadership, in all of its variances, is about helping people become such followers of Jesus Christ. This course will focus on facilitating discovery of what it means to (1) be a follower of Jesus and (2) lead people toward their own personal progressive sanctification.

“Intro to the NT: Romans to Revelation”

taught by Dr. Chris Gardner and held on Mondays from 6:00 to 7:25 pm.

As believers in Jesus Christ, we need to be students of God’s Word. In order to improve your ability to rightly divide the Word of God, a good student of the Word needs to understand the basic purpose of each New Testament book. This course will focus on gaining a grasp of the purpose of each of the epistles and the book of Revelation.

“How to Study the Bible: Level I - Observation”

taught by Dr. Chris Gardner and held on Mondays from 7:30 to 8:55 pm.

All serious Christians want to study the Word of God, but discerning what the biblical text is all about is not easy. This course will provide guidance in the first of three steps of solid Bible Study: observation. Before you can apply the Scripture to your life or teach the Bible, you need to learn to seriously observe the biblical text.

“The Ministry of being a Shepherd”

taught by Pastor Richard Yieldhouse and held on Mondays from 6:00 to 7:25 pm.

cost \$80

A study of Bedouin and Divine shepherding. This class will primarily be in a discussion format. Required textbook is “While Shepherds Watched Their Flocks,” Timothy S. Laniak. We will also use “A Shepherd Looks at the 23rd Psalm,” Phillip Keller. This class is aimed at helping parents, teachers, pastors, and other leaders care for those in their flocks.

“How We Got Our Bible”

taught by Pastor Glenn Hulbert and held on Mondays from 7:30 to 8:55 pm.

This course seeks to strengthen the student’s conviction that the Bible is truly the Word of God, and as such, it is absolutely reliable, authoritative, and effective in all that it teaches. To accomplish this, the student will be instructed on the nature of God’s word and the process by which this book has become the foundation of our faith and practice.

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
